Three Gas Stations Found in Violation during Liquor Compliance Check In Machesney Park

In response to multiple citizen complaints regarding the unlawful sale of alcohol to minors, the Winnebago County Sheriff's Office – Machesney Park Division, in coordination with the Village of Machesney Park and the Illinois Liquor Control Commission, conducted a liquor control compliance operation on Saturday, October 4, 2025.

During the coordinated effort, a total of five gas stations throughout the Village of Machesney Park were checked for compliance with Illinois liquor laws. The purpose of these checks is to ensure that businesses are operating in accordance with state law and to protect the safety of minors in the community.

Results of the Compliance Checks:

 - Clerk: Rahu Manoharanradl (dob: 08/26/1995)
 - · Charge: Sale of Alcohol to a Minor
- 3. Amoco Gas Station 8320 N. 2nd Street
 - Clerk: Marcos Torres (dob: 07/31/2000)
 - Charge: Sale of Alcohol to a Minor

"Selling alcohol to minors is a serious offense that puts our youth and community at risk," said Sheriff Caruana. "We will continue to work closely with our local partners to ensure that businesses follow the law and help us maintain a safe environment for everyone in Winnebago County."
